



Dear Parents/Carers,

RE: Coronavirus (COVID-19) Update

As you're probably aware, the government's guidance on the Coronavirus has changed from the 'contain' phase to one of delaying the spread of the virus. We're getting in touch to let you know what we're doing in light of this, and what we expect from all of you, to help make sure our school community keeps safe and calm.

We'd like to reassure you that at Meadowcroft School we're taking all of the necessary steps to protect our community and are continuing to follow official guidance from the government

What's the current situation?

- The **school remains open** – this is the current official guidance we've been given
- All school functions continue to run as normal
- Pupils should attend unless they feel unwell – if your child has any of the following symptoms they **should remain at home for 7 days**:
 - a new, continuous cough and/or
 - a temperature
- If your child is unwell, report this as you would normally by contacting the site in which your child attends; The Hub: 01924 366242, The Gallery: 01924 368736 and the Works:01924 368257
- End of term trips are currently under review and we will inform you in due course.
- There are no immediate examinations that are due to take place, however we will keep you informed of any significant changes that may impact future examinations including GCSEs
- We'll keep you up to date with any changes to the current situation

What we're doing to protect and support pupils and staff

The school have already in place a contingency plan that clearly outlines how the school will continue to protect and support all of our pupils and staff during a period of national uncertainty

- If your child should arrive to school and display symptoms associated with COVID-19; arrangements with yourself will be made to send them home. We will





make every attempt to use Passenger Transport Services to do this, however please be aware that you may be asked to collect your child in person

- Our cleaning team have been instructed to carry out extra 'deep cleans' in all classrooms, dining areas and staff and pupils toilets and basins
- Reinforcing hand-washing protocols and providing hand sanitisers (subject to availability) wherever required
- Tutorials and Lessons for pupils about hygiene and how to deal with anxiety
- In order to reduce school visitors to your home; the school have decided that all home visits, **including Home Tuition will be suspended from Wednesday 18th March 2020**. This is not a decision the school has taken lightly, however in the interest of public health and safety for families, young people and staff we feel that it is a necessary precaution. Home Study packs will be made available to all pupils receiving Home Tuition from Wednesday the 18th and will be collected weekly. The provided will be skills and knowledge appropriate and will continue to follow the coverage of the curriculum.
- The school has decided to postpone all non-essential visitors to the school and all meetings with external agencies will be conducted via telephone conferencing

What we need you to do

- If you've recently changed your contact details, please inform the school office **as soon as possible** via email: info@meadowcroftschoo.com or Telephone: 01924 366242
- Talk to your children about the Coronavirus. It's a scary time and we should make sure children feel supported. [BBC Newsround](#) has regular updates for younger children and [YoungMinds](#) has practical steps older children can take to help with anxiety
- Re-inforce the handwashing advisory protocol (attached)
- Keep your child off from school if they have a new/continuous cough and/or a temperature and begin a period of isolation. I have attached guidance and advice from Public Health England on better protecting yourself and others during the self-isolation phase.
- Come and collect your child straight away, if we ask you to (we'll contact you if they become ill with either a temperature or a new, continuous cough)

What happens if the school has to close?





We'll only close if we're either officially advised to do so or we don't have enough staff to run the school.

In either case:

- We will alert you as parents via text message; in addition to this our Family Liaison Officers will attempt to follow this personally by calling. We will also be updating our website with daily updates regarding closures and openings – you can find the information on: <https://meadowcroftschoo.com>
- We will also use the same alert process to inform you when the school will re-open
- The school have prepared emergency education packs which will cover a wide range of subjects including English, Maths and Science. You will be provided with approximately 2 weeks worth of work in the event of any school closure. Should the school be closed for more than 2 weeks we will be in contact with you about how we intend to provide your child with additional work
- If you are unsure whether the school has your email address, please contact the office to update this. This will be particularly helpful in being able to send you any additional work. In addition, we are currently exploring the use of our Acorn Digital Learning platform as a method of learning during a period of potential closure. We will create a mailing group to update you all whether this will be available and how let you know how you can access it.
- The school will continue to support you as parents and your child by maintaining regular contact. Our Family Liaison Officers and support staff will make daily contact via telephone and in some cases may conduct a personal face to face visit (albeit complying to any risk assessments that is associated with personal contact – i.e. staff may just have a conversation with you at your front door). In any case we will be committed in supporting yourselves over this period of national uncertainty.

Please keep in mind that we're only sending out this information to help the school community prepare. There are currently no plans to close.
